Diversity Committee From Jennifer Ford

The Diversity Committee was created in 2014 in response to the obvious need to expand our knowledge about other



cultures, religions, races, ethnicities. In 2019, AAUW declared DEI (Diversity, Equity, Inclusion) as a primary mission of the organization. We were ahead of the game.

We have heard stories of MMIW (Missing and

Murdered Indigenous Women), Russian women, Muslim women, women of Afghanistan, Pakistan, Ukraine, Women of Color among our own members, STEM women of science, and so many more. We have been enriched by the stories of these women.

Every June, we honor Extraordinary Women. Our goal is to continue this tradition.

We usually meet the fourth Thursday of the month, 1pm, at members' homes. We have taken walks downtown to appreciate the public art, eaten at restaurants, or gone wherever our interests or our speakers took us.
