Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America From Rachel Campbell

At the recent National Voter Registration Fair held at the Gail Borden Library, I met a representative of MOMS DEMAND ACTION FOR GUN SENSE IN AMERICA. Because this is an issue of interest to many of our members, I would like to tell our Branch a little about this organization.

MOMS is a grassroots movement of Americans fighting for public safety measures that respect the Second Amendment and protect people from gun violence. MOMS campaigns for news and stronger solutions to lax gun laws and loopholes that jeopardize the safety of our children and families.

Recently MOMS launched the BE SMART campaign to take action to promote responsible gun ownership and reduce child gun deaths and responsible gun storage. Volunteers encourage parents and caretakers to "BE SMART" and take these five simple steps to help prevent shootings by children:

Secure all guns in your home and vehicles; Model responsible behavior around guns; Ask about the presence of unsecured guns in other homes; Recognize the risks of teen suicide; Tell your peers to be SMART.
